| <b>Relation to Curriculum</b>                    | <p>This course is a compulsory course and must be passed by students before completing the second semester.</p> <p>This course studies about Normal Labor Care. The content of this course includes the physiology and mechanism of normal labor, the stages (times) of normal labor, history taking and physical examination of the mother, monitoring the progress of labor using partographs so as to be able to carry out rapid and appropriate treatment to avoid complications that can occur during labor.</p> <p>It is expected that after completing this course, learners are competent in performing normal labor care and normal newborn care.</p> <p>The duration of the course lasts for 1 semester with activities in the form of normal childbirth care training for 1 week consisting of practice on the model and face-to-face. After completing the training, learners will practice on patients in order to achieve competence. The requirements for graduation are to submit 10 corrected partograph sheets and fill in the competency list in the log book and take the MCQ exam at the end of the semester.</p> |
